Develop transferable soft skills including:

- Communication skills talking with team members and in written form.
- Confidence by approaching people and getting a positive response.
- Teamwork this is key to understand other people's skill sets and to give great customer service
- Problem-solving "tell me a time when you solved a problem" is a common job interview question
- Awareness.



Other benefits:

- Etiquette How to do things/ speak to people appropriately by watching others with more experience.
- Cultural awareness What is ok in one country or section of society is not ok in another.



Q Key Facts:

- Start Dates: All year round.
- Duration: 6 weeks minimum for a full-time or part-time placement.

Students are encouraged to book at least 1 or 2 weeks of General English before starting the Internship placement.

- Hours: Part-time or full-time.
- Sectors: (Charity) Administration, IT, Marketing, Social Media, Social Care, Care Giving, Shops & Retail.
- Certificate: Issued on successful completion.
- Location: Ireland.



Programme requirements:

- English level: B1+ preferable.
- EU Passport holders.
- Students are encouraged to study at least 1 or 2 weeks before starting the placement.

Irish Cancer Society Shop Dún Laoghaire -Cancer related charity

Booking Process

Step 1

Before checking availability, please submit the following documents:

CV in word format.

Cover letter / Email:

- State the field the student is looking for.
- State if the student is looking for a full or part-time experience.
- · Desired start date.
- Desired location (Dublin jobs could be in central Dublin or outside Dublin in Dun Laoghire).
- Have your student take the EP Placement test https://www.englishpath.com/english-path-initial-placement-test
- Provide availability to book the first online Interview with our Student Support Officer (the second and final interviews will take place 2 to 4 weeks prior to arrival with the Charity Internship company directly).

Step 2

Once the placement has been confirmed:

- Pay the non-refundable placement fee.*
- Submit the internship Placement Terms and Conditions form (which will be sent to your student with the initial Booking Confirmation).
- Send us flight details and be ready to start the programme.
