What are my study options in Germany?

A) Direct access to university – University pathway programme

Bachelor's degrees

Eligibility for direct entry depends on your country of origin and academic background. EP Berlin will conduct a pre-evaluation to determine your eligibility.

Master's degrees

Germany offers 10,000+ Master's programmes across 400+ institutions. Admission is based on various criteria like university recognition, GPA, and study history. EP Berlin will assist in the pre-evaluation phase.

B) Indirect access to university - Studienkolleg Preparation

Studienkolleg are public educational institutions offering foundation-year courses for international students who wish to pursue higher education in Germany but whose secondary school qualifications are not recognised as equivalent to the German Abitur. These preparatory programs are taught entirely in German and are designed to bridge the academic and language gap, enabling students to meet university entry requirements.

To enroll, students must pass an entrance exam, which typically includes a German language component at the B2/C1 level and may also feature a mathematics test, depending on the chosen academic track. The program consists of two semesters of subject-specific instruction, culminating in the Feststellungsprüfung (FSP)—a final assessment that evaluates your readiness for university studies in your intended field.

Upon successful completion of the FSP, students are eligible to apply to universities across Germany in their chosen area of study. Studienkolleg is studied on University campus and usually lasts 12 months.



How does it work, and how long does it take?

Step 1: Pre-evaluation 1 week (free-of charge)

- Fill out the **form**
 - All information & documents should be provided in German or English only, no other languages accepted.
 - Documents do not need to be officially translated nor certified/authenticated at this stage of the pre-evaluation process.
- Submit academic documents
- Take an online German level test to determine your current level:
 - Take your **grammar, vocabulary test**
 - Book your **speaking test**
- Receive a tailored evaluation and roadmap

Step 2: Book your language course package (price at the end of the document)

Application process (Mandatory) EUR845 – approx. 8 to 36 weeks, depending on nationality.

- We'll guide you through document authorisation, translation, notarisation, and submission.
- We'll support you in preparing and submitting your university admission applications.
- You'll receive at least one Conditional Letter of Acceptance (CLA) or VPD (Vorprüfungsdocumentation) from a German university.
- You'll be provided with a personalised study plan based on your academic goals.

Visa Assistance Process (For Non-EU Applicants)

- We'll help you prepare the required documents for your visa application.
- We'll assist with setting up a blocked account and health insurance in Germany.
- You'll apply for the correct type of student visa with a complete and compliant document set.
- You'll receive your study visa and get ready to begin your pathway programme at EP Berlin.

Step 3: German course at EP Berlin (16–50 weeks)

- You'll need to obtain C1-Academic German level to enter a public University
- You'll receive student support and academic counselling from our team
- Take *Telc C1 Hochschule* Exam – included in your package fees

Step 4 (optional): Preparation for Studienkolleg entry test.

To be booked after arriving at EP Berlin.

To ensure students are thoroughly prepared for the entrance exam of the German foundation year (Studienkolleg), we assist with booking an online preparatory courses. Students can choose to focus on preparation for specific Studienkollegs. The prep course should be booked on-site after selecting the desired Studienkolleg for application. A minimum German language level of B1/B2 is required to enroll in the online prep course.

Step 5 (optional): University Placement (6–8 weeks) EUR500

- Programme shortlisting in the field of study at your desired university/Studienkolleg or suitable alternatives
- Application guidance and document preparation
- Ongoing support and assistance with residence permit and insurance
- We'll help you with preparing your documents including your CV and personal statement
- We'll assist you with notarising the copy of your original documents
- We'll help you arrange your public health insurance, apply for a new residence permit and obtain student status and a student visa

Levels: Beginner to advanced A1 (Elementary) > C1

Duration: 16 - 50 weeks

Start dates: Every Monday, year-round

- **Classic Morning German 20:** 20 lessons/week
- **Semi-intensive Morning 25:** 25 lessons/week



You'll take your Classic Morning 20 **OR** Semi-intensive Morning 25 course for the necessary duration, followed by four weeks of an exam preparation course before your language exam.

*Please note that language level progression may take longer depending on individual learning pace and other factors. Keep in mind that German public universities have two main intakes per year: the winter semester, which typically starts in October, and the summer semester, which usually begins in March. To help you reach your required language level as quickly and efficiently as possible, we highly recommend enrolling in the **Semi-Intensive 25 German course**, which offers a faster learning pace compared to Classic Morning 20.
