Transport & Airport Transfers

Transport

All transport for the included activities in your programme is covered, so there's no need to worry about extra travel costs. Optional trips may be offered, with public transport usually costing around £4 per journey.

Our London programme gives you the chance to explore one of the world's most exciting cities. You'll visit famous sights like the Tower of London, Big Ben, and Buckingham Palace, and experience the rich history and culture that London has to offer—all through a safe, well-organised and memorable schedule

Airport Transfers

At English Path, we aim to make your arrival and departure as smooth and safe as possible.

- Arrival at the airport: When you land, connect to the airport Wi-Fi or use your mobile data to
 check for a welcome message from English Path. Once you have collected your luggage and
 passed through security, look for a member of EP staff wearing an English Path T-shirt or
 lanyard and holding an EP sign. You will be met at a clearly designated meeting point in the
 arrivals hall, where staff will welcome you and escort you safely to your residence.
- **Emergency Contact:** If you cannot find your EP representative, call the 24-hour emergency phone number provided in this handbook. Please **do not leave the airport** without speaking to a staff member.
- Missed or Delayed Flights: If your flight is delayed or missed, please ask your parent, guardian
 or group leader to notify EP immediately using the emergency number. We will update your
 transport arrangements and ensure someone is available to meet you.
- Independent Arrivals and Departures: Students arriving or departing without a group or chaperone must:
 - Inform EP of their travel details at least 7 days in advance.
 - Receive written approval from their parents or legal quardians.
 - Be met by EP staff at the airport unless agreed otherwise.
- For your departure, EP staff will accompany you to the airport, support you with check-in
 procedures, and guide you through to security control. Our staff will remain at the airport until
 your flight has departed, and in case of delays, cancellations, or any issues, they will be there to
 assist you. To ensure everyone boards safely and on time, students are contacted 40 minutes
 before departure—whether at the residence or duty-free shops!

Staff will be present during key travel windows, and students will not be left alone during transfers. Please follow staff instructions and always wear your EP ID.

Personal safety and looking after your valuables

Our campuses are safe places to be, but as with a lot of touristic places you should always be alert. We would like you to have a lovely experience. Here is some advice to help you have a safe and worry-free time during your stay.

- Be alert when you are walking in crowded places.
- Avoid carrying large amounts of cash unless you know you need to pay for something.
- Do not leave your belongings unattended.

Our campuses are safe places to be, but as with a lot of public spaces, you should always be alert. It is important to have good situational awareness, especially while visiting touristic places where pickpockets and phone snatchers are not uncommon. For you to have the best possible experience, here is some advice to help you have a safe and worry-free time during your stay.

- Be alert when you are walking in crowded places.
- Do not walk with your phone in your hand if you are not using it.
- Place your valuables (such as phone and wallet) in inside pockets or in your bag.
- Avoid carrying large amounts of cash unless you know you need to pay for something.

Fire safety

If you discover a fire: Press the fire alarm button on the nearest alarm.

Leave the building immediately via the stairs and fire exit. Make sure you tell a member of EP staff exactly what happened so they can call the Fire Brigade.

If you hear the fire alarm: Leave the building immediately via the stairs and fire exit. Do not run, use the lift or stop to collect your belongings. EP staff will guide you to the fire exit. Go to the assembly point and stay with your class and teacher there.


Follow any instructions given by a member of EP staff and do not go back into the building until you are told to do so by EP staff.

At English Path, learning English is fun!

At English Path, we use the CEFR (Common European Framework of Reference for Languages) to place you in the most suitable class for your age & level.

Prior arrival you have to complete a placement test (grammar, writing, and speaking) so we can place you into the right group. You'll be in a class with students who are at a similar level, so you can feel confident and make progress.

During the course, your teachers and our academic team will check your progress. You'll also complete a mid-course feedback questionnaire to help us improve your learning experience.

At the end of your programme, you will receive an English Path Certificate of Attendance, which includes:

- · Your name and course dates
- Your CEFR level
- Your attendance record

Let's have a look at the following tips to make sure you get the most out of your experience.

Study skills

Study Skills refer to the ability to frame and improve our learning. For example, what do we do when we learn a new word? Do we make notes? How?

It's very important that we are organised in the way we learn, so that we have a much better chance of remembering the language and using it correctly in the future.

We would like to share with you some ways to keep learning and improving your English skills. If you practice these Study Skills, they will help you to continue your English language learning wherever you are.

Using a dictionary

Dictionaries are a useful resource for researching different meanings, collocations, examples of use and standard pronunciation. Use a mono-lingual dictionary and focus on understanding the meaning rather than translation of individual words. Translating individual words can often lead to misunderstandings.

A great, big paper mono-lingual dictionary is best but Cambridge, for example, have an online advanced learners' dictionary at www.dictionary.cambridge.org, which is easy to use and provides examples of word use.

Useful language

Here is some advice and a few ideas to help you with the following:

- Vocabulary
- Grammar
- Listening
- Reading
- Speaking
- Pronunciation
- Writing
- Irregular Verbs
- Language Bank

Learning vocabulary

When you record vocabulary, you should also include longer phrases like phrasal verbs (e.g. get away with), multi-word expressions (e.g. How's it going?), idioms (e.g. raining cats and dogs), and collocations (e.g. take a chance).

Library and study area

There is a bright Library/ Study-Centre available for students which is a great opportunity to help you get more out of your studies. If you would like to use please let the EP staff know and they will help you to get access. There are open areas where you can work with your classmates and access the internet.

Dare to grab a book/Grab a book/Borrow a book and discover your progress as your understanding of content evolves!

Here are some ways to learn vocabulary.



- Download the Quizlet app create your own set of flashcards, practice and test yourself!
- Cut out lots of strips of paper or use index cards. Use the Language Bank you have made
 and write a word on one side of each strip, with the translation or definition on the other
 side. Now you can place your cards on a table and test yourself by placing either all the
 English sides, or all the translations/definitions, face down and test your memory.
- Make two cards with the English word and its translation on different cards. Put all these cards on a table and play a game of Snap! Here's how:
- 1 Place all of the cards face down
- 2. Take one card and place it face up.
- 3. Take another card and place it face up.
- 4. If the two cards are the English word and its translation you have Snap! Place the two cards at the side of the table and continue until you have matched all the cards.
- 5. Try timing yourself and completing the game as guickly as possible.

Listening, reading and writing

What to write?

Getting the new language you've learnt down on paper can really help to consolidate your learning. Think about the language you've learnt that week and try the following:

- Write an email to a friend/your teacher
- Write a diary/journal entry each day
- Write your shopping list in English

What to read?

There's so much you can read to practice your skills; it doesn't have to be a book. You can read signs, newspapers, the back of food packets!

- · Why don't you find an interesting article online?
- Choose a book you've read in your own language and get reading!
- Find an e-book and read on your daily commute to work or studies. This site has lots of free ones: gutenberg.org

Try to listen to as many different types of spoken English as possible to improve your listening. You can find lots on the internet:

Daily Routine & Safety

Timetable

Your English classes will vary throughout the week. On Mondays, you will have a 3-hour lesson. You will be placed in either Group A or Group B, and your group allocation will be confirmed when you arrive at the camp.

During the rest of the week, you will take part in:

- Two full days of lessons (6 hours per day, with regular breaks to help you relax and focus).
- and two full days of leisure activities, including on-site and off-site excursions.

On excursion days, you will be provided with a packed lunch, and you will return to campus in time for dinner. On other days, after your morning activities, you will return to campus for lunch. In the afternoon, you will have some free time before your 3-hour evening class, which includes two short breaks.

After class, it's dinner time, followed by evening activities. You'll then return to your accommodation before curfew (10:00 pm / 22:00)

Please remember:

- Students must not leave the premises unaccompanied.
- Curfew times and all school rules must be respected at all times for your safety and that of others.

Daily Routine & Safety

Staff Supervision and Student Safety

Your safety is our priority. We ensure students are always supervised by trusted and trained staff.

Supervision ratios depend on your age:

- Ages 8 to 12: 1 staff member for every 15 students
- Ages 13 to 17: 1 staff member for every 20 students

We also follow these ratios during lessons, activities, trips and in the residence. For excursions or high-risk activities, smaller groups are used to keep everyone safe.

Residence and Campus Access & Supervision

While the university campus follows an open access policy, English Path ensures that students are always supervised when on site.

Our staff work on a rotational schedule throughout the day and evening, particularly in communal areas, toilet corridors, and transition zones, to make sure that:

- Only authorised individuals are near students.
- No strangers are able to approach or engage with students without supervision.
- Welfare and safeguarding standards are met at all times.

In the residence, entry is controlled by university staff. Security staff are present on site 24/7. Visitors are only allowed if they have been authorised and accompanied by the residence team.

Entry to the buildings is controlled with electronic key cards. Strangers without a pass or booking are not permitted under any circumstances. English Path staff are present and supervising every evening, conducting regular checks and being available in case you need support.

ID badges & wristbands must be worn at all times. Students are not allowed to open residence doors to anyone, and should always inform a staff member if something doesn't feel right.

At English Path, we want everyone to enjoy their time, learn lots, and stay safe. To help make that happen, we ask you to follow the rules below. These rules are here to protect you and everyone around you. Students may be asked to leave their course early if they don't follow the code of conduct or EP's disciplinary policy.

General Behaviour & Respect

- Be kind, polite and respectful to other students, staff, group leaders and members of the public.
- Treat others as you would like to be treated. Bullying, harassment (in person or online),
 and discrimination will not be tolerated.
- Respect everyone's culture, religion, background and identity. We all come from different places and that makes our school special.
- Follow all EP rules and instructions from staff they are here to keep you safe.
- If a student breaks the rules, they may receive a warning, be removed from activities or classes, and in serious cases, parents or guardians will be contacted and the student may be sent home.

In Class

- Speak English at all times this helps everyone improve!
- Be on time and attend all your lessons. You must attend 100% of classes this is part of our programme.
- Phones are not allowed in class, unless your teacher asks you to use it for learning.
- No food or drink in classrooms (except bottled water).
- Tell a staff member if you feel unwell and can't attend class.

Personal Conduct & Safety

- Follow British laws: no smoking, no drinking alcohol, no drugs.
- If you are under 18, it is illegal to buy or drink alcohol or smoke.
- Drugs are strictly forbidden this is a serious offence in the UK.
- Do not leave the school or residence without permission or a staff member.
- Respect curfews and supervision rules these are there to protect you.

Digital Behaviour

- Use phones, laptops and the internet responsibly and kindly.
- Do not post hurtful or inappropriate content about others.
- If you see something that makes you uncomfortable, tell a staff member immediately.

Student's insurance

All full experience programmes at English Path include a *Multirisk GuardMe* Insurance, which covers doctor and hospital visits, prescribed medicines, emergency treatment and more.

If you are enrolled in Day or Tuition Only programme means your parents are with us in the country and they have pre booked an insurance.

GuardMe Multirisk Policy

The policy provides broad protection, including:

- Medical expenses for illness or accident:
 - Covered up to a limit (check policy for more details) for emergency treatment, including doctor visits, hospitalisation, A&E, and outpatient care.
 - Pharmacy costs:
 - ✓ Covered when prescribed by a doctor as part of a medical treatment plan.
 - The UK healthcare system, patients typically must pay a standard charge for prescription medications, which as of 2025 is around £9.90 per item (set by the NHS in England). This charge is not usually reimbursed
 - Emergency care and ambulance transport:
 - ✓ Covered when medically necessary, within the overall medical expense limit.
 - Repatriation or return travel:
 - Covered up to a limit (check policy for more details) in case of serious illness, accident, or death.
 - o 24/7 emergency assistance line:
 - ✓ A 24-hour multilingual helpline is available for urgent medical guidance and claims support.

What to Do If You Feel Unwell 🐽



If you are not feeling well, follow these steps to make sure you get the care you need:

For individual students:

- 1. Tell a member of EP staff straight away.
- 2. If you can't find anyone, call the emergency phone number (on your ID card or in this handbook).
- 3. A staff member will take you to the local pharmacy.
- 4. The nurse or pharmacist will give you guidance. If further help is needed, staff will take you to a GP, hospital, or A&E depending on the situation.
- 5. Staff cannot give you any medicine, unless a doctor has prescribed it. If medication is prescribed, staff will supervise to ensure it is taken safely.
- 6. If you need to use your insurance, staff will help you with the claim process.

If you are part of a group:

- 1. Your Group Leader is your first point of contact.
- 2. Let them know how you feel they will support you and notify EP staff.
- 3. The EP team will then follow the same steps above to make sure you receive appropriate care.
- 4. While your group leader remains your responsible adult, the EP team is here to help and guide you throughout the process.

Dental Support

Dental insurance generally encompasses both routine and emergency dental procedures, with certain policies offering global coverage. Typically, these policies require you to pay for dental services upfront, after which you can submit a claim to your insurer for reimbursement. However, it is important to recognize that not all policies are identical.

Numerous private dental practitioners impose fees for their services. It is advisable to consult your insurance policy for details regarding its dental coverage.

If you are experiencing dental discomfort, please reach out to a member of our team for assistance, and they will help you obtain the necessary care.

Our Young Learner programmes include a full timetable of exciting cultural, educational, and social activities to help you enjoy the best of British life while making friends and practising your English in real-world settings.

Activities include sightseeing tours, cultural visits, sports, themed evenings, and excursions to iconic destinations such as museums and royal parks.

🗂 Weekly Activity Schedule

A weekly activity schedule is shared at the centre, during induction and a reminder is shared the day before of the agenda for next day. Please note:

- All activities are mandatory unless otherwise advised for specific reasons (e.g., illness).
- The programme has been carefully designed to balance learning, fun, and student welfare.

Student safety is our top priority. Supervision is provided at all times by trained staff:

- . 1:20 ratio for students aged 13+
- 1:15 ratio for students aged 8-12

Staff roles are clearly allocated for each excursion, including first aiders, group leaders, and designated meeting points. Extra care is taken during transport, high-traffic areas, and late returns.

Before any outing, you'll attend a compulsory safety briefing which covers:

- · The destination and cultural context
- · Emergency contact information
- How to stay safe and what to do if separated
- · The name and phone number of your lead staff member
- 🖰 Free Time Supervised Independence

During some city visits, short periods of free time are allowed in clearly defined areas. You'll be asked to:

- · Remain in small groups
- Share your live location with EP staff via mobile phone
- Check in at set times and return to the meeting point punctually

This helps you enjoy some independence while ensuring staff can support you at all times.





The London Eye - The world's largest cantilevered observation wheel. Located across the Thames from Westminster, the London Eye gives unparalleled views across London.

Buckingham Palace - Buckingham Palace became the royal residence in 1837 and is the official residence of the present monarch, Charles III.

Covent Garden - Located in the West End of London, Covent Garden is renowned for its luxury fashion and beauty stores, as well as award-winning restaurants and theatres.

Tower Bridge - Built over 125 years ago and beyond being one of London's favourite icons, it is arguably one of the most famous and instantly recognisable structures in the entire world.

The British museum - Bursting with interesting artifacts that have been collected from all over the world. During a visit to the British Museum, you can discover the Elgin Marbles, Rosetta Stone and the Mummies from ancient Egypt.

Natural History Museum - Known for its iconic dinosaur exhibits, this museum showcases a remarkable collection of specimens, including fossils, minerals, and interactive displays.

Victoria and Albert Museum - Dedicated to art and design, with an extensive collection spanning fashion, sculpture, ceramics, photography, and more.

Fish and chips - Traditionally a popular food to eat at the seaside, fish and chips is the most famous food in the UK, consisting of battered, fried fish, chips and mushy peas!

An English breakfast - Hearty and traditional morning meal in England, it includes bacon, sausages, eggs, tomatoes, mushrooms, baked beans, fried bread and often a slice of white or black pudding.

Sunday roast - It is a traditional British meal that is typically served on Sunday, consisting of roasted meat and potatoes and accompaniments such as Yorkshire puddings and stuffing.

Pie and Mash - Originated in the East End of London, it consists of a variety of fillings, baked in a pastry crust and served with mashed potatoes and a thin green parsley sauce.
