Courses Overview

Foundation

The Foundation Pathway is a one-year programme for international students preparing for higher study or vocational qualifications. Available in Business, Management, or Information Technology, it builds essential academic knowledge, practical skills, and confidence, preparing students for progression to Level 4 or 5 study, undergraduate degrees, or employment.

EAP+

This programme is ideal for academically qualified students with a strong GPA who need additional English support to meet the language entry requirements (e.g., IELTS 6.0). EAP consists of 3 hours per morning lessons, 5 days a week for the language part and 6 hours per week in the afternoon for either research methods or transition to university.

Pre-Master

For students whose academic background does not yet meet direct entry requirements – for example, those with a low GPA or without a university degree – a full Pre-Master's programme provides the preparation needed. This pathway is also ideal for students changing fields, such as a history graduate seeking admission to an MSc in Computer Science.

Accelerated Pre-Master

Designed for bachelor's degree holders whose GPA falls below the direct entry threshold, this programme provides the academic preparation needed to progress to a master's degree.



A summary of our Pathway courses

Foundation	EAP+	Pre-Masters or Accelerated Pre-Masters
<p>The Foundation Pathway is a full-year programme designed to prepare international students for further academic study or entry into vocational qualifications. It is available in Business, Management or Information Technology and helps students develop essential knowledge, practical competencies, and academic confidence.</p> <p>Throughout the year, students engage in hands-on learning through projects, assignments, and collaborative tasks. The curriculum focuses on building core skills such as communication, teamwork, research, digital literacy, and critical thinking. These are the foundational capabilities sought by universities and employers alike.</p> <p>In the Business and Management pathways, students explore areas such as marketing, finance, customer service, and human resources, gaining insight into how these functions operate within real-world organisations. In the Information Technology pathway, learners develop technical skills in systems, software, and IT support, while also understanding the role of technology in business environments.</p> <p>Study Skills modules support academic development, including essay writing, referencing, time management, and presentation techniques. By the end of the programme, students will have a clear understanding of their academic and career direction, and be well-prepared to progress to Level 4 or 5 qualifications, undergraduate degrees, or entry-level employment.</p>	<p>The English for Academic Purposes course is a structured pre-sessional program designed for secondary school graduates preparing for undergraduate (EAP+UG) or postgraduate (EAP+PG) study in English-speaking institutions. It aims to develop academic English proficiency to IELTS 6.0 or equivalent, alongside essential study skills for university-level success.</p> <p>The course spans 12 in Dubai or 15 weeks in Malta (comprising 12 weeks of tuition, 1 mid-term break, 1 revision week, and 1 final exam week). Students receive approximately 21 hours of classroom instruction per week, delivered either in-person or via blended online formats across EP College campuses or partner university sites.</p> <p>The curriculum integrates academic reading, writing, listening, and speaking with a focus on genre-specific writing (essays, reports), vocabulary acquisition, and grammatical accuracy. Listening and speaking modules simulate lectures, seminars, and presentations. Academic skills training includes critical reading, structured note-taking, source referencing (APA/Harvard), time management, and oral presentation techniques.</p> <p>Entry requirements include IELTS 5.0 (minimum 5.0 in all components) and a secondary school diploma for EAP+UG or Undergraduate degree for EAP+PG. Upon completion, students receive an EP certificate and assessment record confirming readiness for undergraduate study. Graduates demonstrate enhanced academic literacy, independent learning strategies, and confidence in navigating university coursework. Applicants should verify if additional English test scores are required by their chosen institution.</p>	<p>The Pre-Master's in Management Studies is designed for international students who hold an undergraduate degree and wish to progress to postgraduate study in business, management, or related fields. It is offered in two formats, of 32 weeks (standard) and 16 weeks (accelerated).</p> <p>This programme bridges academic and linguistic gaps, ensuring students are fully prepared for the demands of a master's degree. The curriculum combines advanced academic English training with core business modules such as Global Business Trends, Research Methods, and Management Theory. Students develop critical thinking, analytical writing, and presentation skills through seminars, case study analysis, and independent research. A key component is the completion of a substantial research project, culminating in a formal report and oral presentation that mirrors the expectations of postgraduate coursework.</p> <p>Daily sessions integrate subject knowledge with academic skills development, including referencing, academic reading, and structured writing. The programme also fosters confidence in seminar participation and professional communication.</p> <p>Upon successful completion, students receive an academic transcript and an EP certificate confirming achievement of IELTS 6.0 equivalent. Graduates are well-equipped for postgraduate study, having demonstrated the ability to engage with complex business concepts and produce independent academic work. Some universities may still require an official IELTS/TOEFL score, so applicants should confirm entry requirements with their chosen institution.</p>

A summary of the key differences between General English (GE) and English for Academic Purposes (EAP). It highlights their goals, contexts, language focus, and outcomes to help learners and educators understand their distinct purposes.
