- Awareness.

- Start Dates: All year round.
- Duration: 2 to 6 weeks, if everyday, or 30 days max in conjunction with an EP programme.

Programme requirements:

- Age: 17+.
- English level: B1+ preferable.
- Visa: Standard Visitor Visa.
- Student must study at least 15 hours per week while participating in the internship.

These are some of the companies we work with:

Oxfam

Oxfam is a world-leading organisation seeking to end poverty globally. In 2020/21, they fundraised £105m. They utilised online sales to generate £7.6m and promoted sustainable fashion through resources that were downloaded over 60,000 times. In 2020, their work allowed for 13.1 million vulnerable people to be supported in times of poverty, conflict and natural disasters across the world.

AgeUK

Age UK provides various services for older people, acting as the largest charity for the elderly in the UK. Hundreds of thousands of older people are supported every year; with multiple offices around the country, 400 shops and support for vulnerable adults in over 40 countries. In 2019/20, Age UK raised over £50m, largely through fundraising, and spent over £60m on charitable activity.

British Red Cross

Established in 1870 as a means of aid for those wounded in war, the British Red Cross provides aid to those in times of crisis both in the UK and globally. In 2020, an income of £305.9m allowed for over £295.3m to be spent on charitable activities. Partners include Amazon UK, the Home Office and Goldman Sachs Gives.

Cancer Research UK

Cancer Research is the world-leading cancer research and awareness charity, formed in 2002. The charity employs 4,500 people, including scientists, doctors and nurses all working with the aim of helping beat cancer sooner. In 2019/20, Cancer Research UK raised over £650m, of which £468.4m was spent on research.

British Heart Foundation

Founded in 1961, the British Heart Foundation is a cardiovascular research charity. In 2020/21 they generated £86m, most of which went toward researching cures and treatments for heart and circulatory diseases. The British Heart Foundation is currently supporting over 900 projects related to heart diseases, totalling £99.7m in funding.







Fashion and Creative Arts Charity

Organisation: Fashion and Creative Arts Training Charity.

Booking Process

Step 1

Before checking availability, please submit the following documents:

CV in word format.

Cover letter / Email:

- State the field the student is looking for.
- State if the student is looking for a full or part-time experience.
- Desired start date.
- Desired location (London, Birmingham, Manchester or Leeds).
- Have your student take the EP Placement test https://www.englishpath.com/english-path-initial-placement-test
- Provide availability to book the first online Interview with our Internships Placement Manager (the second and final interviews will take place 2 to 4 weeks prior to arrival with the Charity Internship company directly).

Step 2

Once the placement has been confirmed:

- Pay the non-refundable placement fee.*
- Submit internship Placement Terms and Conditions form (which will be sent to your student with the initial Booking Confirmation).
- Send us flight details and be ready to start the programme.
